- Shibuya Sky 229M up in Sky, one of the trendiest spot in Tokyo.

TOUR ITINERARY

Day 1 Fly to Japan from Canada Via Taipei by China Airlines

Day 2 Arrival Narita Airport, transfer to one of the hotels in Narita, free on your own after dinner. Hotel: Nikko Narita or similar (D)

Day 3 Asakusa Temple – Tsujiki Outer Market – Ginza – Shibuya Sky – Shinjuku.

Asakusa Temple, the oldest temple in the city, founded in the 7th century, home to the Goddess of Mercy. Nakamise Dori, pedestrian lane lined with souvenirs shops. Tsujiki Outer Market, once was the largest fish market in Japan, now is food paradise. Ginza where you can find most world's brand-name shops, shopper's paradise. Shibuya Sky, take a view that scratches out from 229m up in the sky of Shibuya. Hotel: Keio Plaza or similar (B/L/D)

Day 4 Meiji Shrine – Odaiba – Yokohama – Mt. Fuji area

Meiji Shrine, is one of the Shinto shrines in Japan, with the vast land of the forest (70 ha.), located in the middle of the megacity, Tokyo. Established in 1920, to commemorate the virtue of Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken who took the initiative to make a foundation of modernized Japan. Odaiba, ultramodern area on Tokyo Bay with Gundam stands guard over Oceanside enterainment area, connecting to Tokyo area by the iconic Rainbow Bridge. Yokohama, the 2nd largest city in Japan, opened port in 1859, become the most prosperous maritime trading center. Staying in a hotspring hotel, to indulge in the onsen culture of Japan.

Hotel: one of the hotspring hotel in Mt. Fuji area. (B/D)

Day 5 Hakone – Peace Park – Lake Ashi – Owakudani – Nagoya

Hakone wedged between Mt. Fuji and Izu Peninsula, encircled by forested mountains, was a very important checkpoint in feudal time, now is a very popular for cherry blossoms, hot spring resort for weekend breaks and holidaymakers, boat rides in Lake Ashi, Owakudani (Greater Boiling Valley) with its plumes of sulphurous steam gushing upward, the magical black eggs cooked by sulphurous water, that you must try. Here is the story, when you ate one black egg, you would increase 7 years longer of your life. Hotel: Tokyu Nagoya or similar (B/L/D)

Day 6 Nagoya Castle – Osu Shopping District – Todaiji Nara

Nagoya Castle, the 1st national treasure castle, was completed in 1615 by Shogun, Tokugawa leyasu, topped with golden tiger fish roof devices bring rain to protect the castle from fire. It is a place of flowers and trees of four seasons. The Osu shopping district is a huge and popular shopping area containing over 1,200 shops and restaurants. All kinds of shops, including electrical appliance shops, secondhand clothing stores, restaurants and cafes are open. The mall is always crowded with people and filled with energy.Osu Kannon Temple located was moved from Osu Village, Mino Province to the current location by the Shogun leyasu Tokugawa in 1612. The antique market is held here on the 18th and 28th of each month. The biggest Buddha statue in Japan from the year of 742, is in Todaiji Temple (UNESCO) in Nara, with lots of deers can be found in the Nara Park. Hotel: La'gent Hotel Kyoto (open in Feb 2023) or similar (B/L/D)

Day 7 Kiyomizu Temple - Ninen Zaka Path/Sannen Zaka Path – Golden Pavilion – Kobe

Kiyomizu Temple, UNESCO, was founded in 778, honour the Goddess of Mercy & Compassion, extended on the cliff by 18 massive pillars, the Kiyomizudera veranda, 13 meter high from the ground by traditional wooden construction – without using any nails. is one of the most iconic image of Japan. Two streets, Ninnenzaka and Sannenzaka, lead to Kiyomizu Temple from Gion, lined with souvenir and snack shops, kimono rental shops and Japanese style cafes, you won't be surprised, even Starbucks can be found there. Golden Pavilion (UNESCO), actually a pagoda made to house the Sacred relics of the Buddha, the official name of Kinkakuji is Rokuan-ji. Both Kiyomizu-dera and Kinkakuji are the most popular sightseeing spots in Kyoto. Kobe, was one of ports first opened to trade with foreigners, other ports are Yokohama, Nagasaki, Hakodate...where you will find mixed Japanese culture with other countries. Hotel: Portopia Hotel Kobe or similar (B/L/D)

Day 8 Kobe – Shinsaibashi – Dotonbori - Kansai

Water quality in Kobe area is one of the best in Japan, lots of wine breweries can be found here, a visit will be paid to a local wine factory, get a chance to wine tasting. In Osaka, Namba is a very popular shopping area of all kinds. Shinsaibashi and Dotonbori areas are the busiest, always crowded with people for shopping, good eats, electronic shops, photo taking, meeting friends..etc. Hotel: Stargate Kansai or similar (B/L/D)



Day 9 Flying back home or to your next destinations. (B)
