Hanayome-Noren Tourist Train in Service



JR West will be running the Hanayome-Noren bridal dress tourist train from 3rd October. Trains will run between Kanazawa and Wakura Onsen, and the ride will be about 80 minutes long, 20 minutes slower than the normal limited express train, to give passengers time to soak up the amazing views from the spacious carriages. Hop on board to get a great view of Ishikawa!

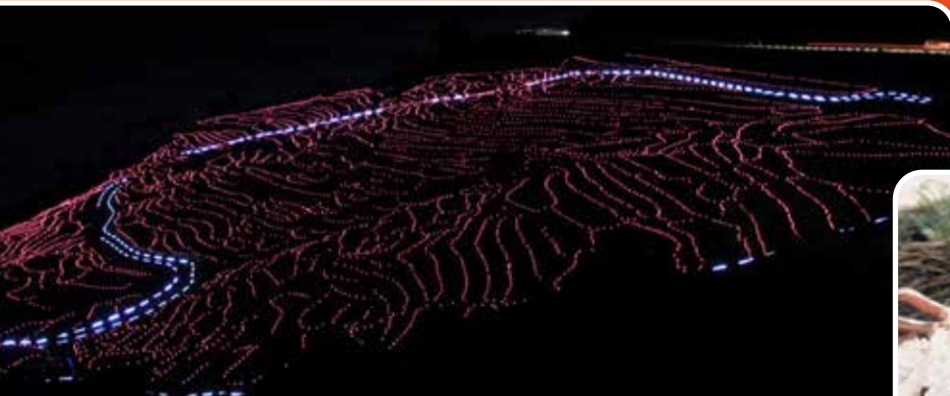

Shoryudo Express Bus Ticket is Back! (from 1st October)

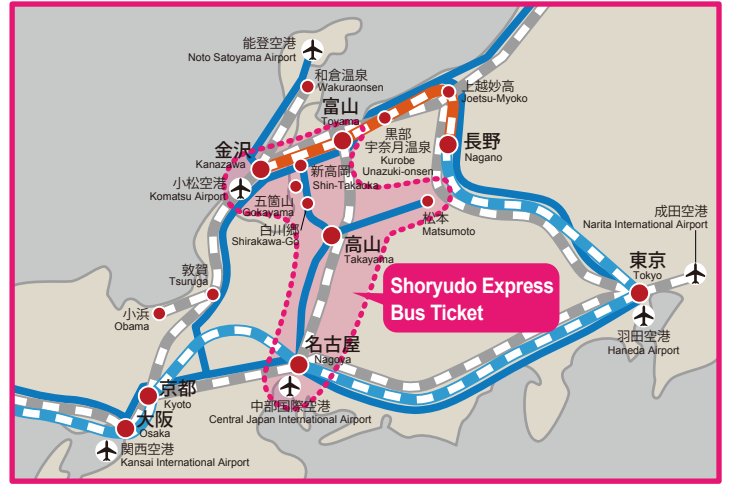
