Itinerary:-

Day 1, Oct 22 (Thu) Vancouver to Hong Kong (other cities in Canada, subject to extra fee).

Fly to Hong Kong from Vancouver to Hong Kong by Air Canada Airlines. Please check in at Vancouver International airport at least 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2, Oct 23 (Fri) Arrival Hong Kong– Shenzhen (B/L/D) Hotel: Crown Plaza Suites Landmark or similar (5stars)

Meet and assist by local representative at Hong Kong airport, transfer to the border of Hong Kong, proceed to Shenzhen via Liantang Port. Visits to **Ping An Finance Centre**, the 2nd tallest building in China, the tallest building in Shenzhen. **Shenzhen Museum**, to learn the history to the present of Shenzhen. The next is to have a ride in the Shenzhen subway, one of the China most futuristic metro stations: the **Eye of Shenzhen**. Lunch & dinner included.

Day 3, Oct 24 (Sat) Shenzhen – Zhongshan –Guangzhou (B/L/D) Hotel: Guangzhou New World Hotel or similar (5 stars)

After breakfast in hotel, via the **Shenzhen-Zhongshanlink**, completed in 2024, a bridge-tunnel connecting 2 major cities, Shenzhen and Zhongshan, cut the travel time from 3 hours to less than 30 minutes. Visits: **Nansha Marina**, the 1st and the only Marina achieved 5 Gold Anchors rating by the Yacht Harbour Association of UK from 2011 up to now. **Baomo Garden**, not only a garden but also a museum, landscape garden in Lingnan culture style, the biggest Along the river during Qingming Festival in porcelain relief can be found and is in World's Guinness record and a huge Flowers and Birds brickcraving wall, meaning of Harmony and Prosperous. **Huangcheng Square**, located on Guangzhou axis, is the Central Business District (the 3rd largest CBD in China), surrounded by the Guangzhou Tower, Haixinsha, Guangzhou Grand Theatre (Opera House), Guangtung Province Museum, Children's Palace, Guangzhou Library. **Pearl River night cruise**, a spectacular and magnificent night views along the Pearl River, one of the most famous 8 sights of Guangzhou. Transfer back to Hotel after dinner.

Day 4, Oct 25 (Sun) Guangzhou – KaiPing (B/L/D) Hotel: Pan Tower International Hotel or similar (5 stars)

After breakfast, visits: the landmark of Guangzhou, **Five Ram Statue of the Yuexiu Park**, and the **Foshan Ancestral Hall** was built in 11th century, the **Huang Feihong Memorial Hall**, the **Ip Man Hall** to commemorate the 2 Fushan born martial art masters, in Huang Feihong Memorial there is Lion dance Kung Fu show, **Foshan Ningnan World**, the mix of the ancient Ningnan style buildings in amodern shopping, leisure and food streets.

Day 5, Oct 26 (Mon) Kaiping(UNESCO site) – Taishan (B/L/D) Hotel: Taishan New World Hotel or similar (5stars)

After breakfast, visits: Chikan Old Town Resort: Travelling in time machine, back to 110 year ago, over 600 veranda style buildings or Qilou buildings, popular place for drama or film makers, street food. **Meijia Compound & Haikou Buwenhua Buildings**, are Taishan's Heritage Treasure, hundreds years ago, thousands of overseas Chinese started their new lives overseas from the Haikou Buwenhua building, was one of the ports of the Maritime Silk road. The **Floating Moon House**, was a showcase of a rural beautiful village in the history of Taishan.

Day 6 Oct 27 (Tue) Taishan–Zhongshan- Zhuhai (B/L/D) Hotel: Double Tree by Hilton Zhuhai Hengqinor similar (5 stars)

After breakfast, visit **Zhan Yuan** in Zhongshan, a modern garden built in 1998, in Suzhou & Hangzhou style. Continue our trip to Zhuhai by **Huangmaohai Sea-crossing Channel**, it gained the IBC recognition 2025, the Gustav Lindenthal Medal, then visit The **Lover's Road, Riyuebei Opera House Zhuhai, Sea & Sky Post House** and the **Ponto Legend** in Hengqiu. Transfer to Hotel after dinner.

Day 7, Oct 28 (Wed) Zhuhai - Macau (B/D) Hotel: Sofitel Macau at Ponte 16or similar (5 stars)

After breakfast, go to Macau via the Hengqiu port. Visits to **Ruin de Sao Paulo**, (UNESCO site from 2005), **Lotus Square, Rua Do Cunha, Handover Gifts Museum of Macao**, The Spectacle of **MGM Macau**, Tree of Prosperity Wynn Macau, and the **Taipa House**. Transfer to Hotel after dinner.

Day 8, Oct 29 (Thu) Macau – Hong Kong (B/L/D) Hotel: New World Millennium Hong Kong Hotel or similar (5 stars)

After breakfast, transfer to Hong Kong via the 55km long, the **Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge**, comprising 12km Hong Kong Link Road, 29.6km Main Bridge, 13.4km Zhuhai Link Road, is the longest bridge-cum-tunnel sea crossing in the world. Opening 24 hours a day, it takes about to travel between Hong Kong Port or Macau Port or Zhuhai Port about 40 minutes. After lunch, check-in hotel after 3 pm.

Evening, transfer to the Central, **a VIP access to the Hong Kong Wine and Dine Festival**, taking place at the Central Harbour front, it promises great wine and delectable treats from around the World, live performances and a deliciously good time, all set against the dazzling Victoria Harbour. Back to Hotel on your own after the event.

Day 9, Oct 30(Fri) Hong Kong Island ½ days (B) Hotel: New World Millennium Hong Kong Hotel or similar (5 stars)

After breakfast, visits: **Nan Lian Garden**, a meticulously landscaped park that also follows the Tang dynasty design principles, and Chi Lin Nunnery provide a serene oasis at the base of the mountains in Diamond Hill. **Victoria Peak** with **Tram ride**, the Central-Mid Levels Escalators, **Tai Kwun** (the building is over 180 years old, the former Central Police station, now is cultural heart of Hong Kong.), transfer back to hotel, free on your own to explore the **Avenue of Stars**, the beautiful **Victoria Harbour, Victoria Dockside, K11 Art and Cultural district**, as these places are just along the coast from New World Millennium Hong Kong Hotel. Daily 8pm, A Symphony of Lights, the spectacular light and sound show at the Victoria Harbour every night.

Day 10, Oct 31 (Sat) Sai Kung ½ day tour (B/L/D) Hotel: New World Millennium Hong Kong Hotel or similar (5 stars)

After breakfast, Visit to **Yim Tin Tsai**, a small island, boasts a charming natural environment and a Hakka village with a rich history of over 300 years, located within the inner water of Sai Kung, visitors can explore Hong Kong's past and present with visits to the UNESCO-listed salt pans and an exploration for its modern art scene. A seafood lunch in one of the restaurants in **Sai Kung**, where is famous for seafood and fishing port in Hong Kong. Transfer back to Hotel for a rest. After the farewell dinner, transfer back to hotel and free on your own to enjoy the rest of your time in Hong Kong.

Day 11, Nov 01 (Sun) Hong Kong – Next Destination (B)

After breakfast, please pack well, and check out the hotel at 11 am or before. Tour ends.
Have a nice and safe flight back home or to your next destination.
